Charting a Bold Future: The Transformative Journey of Cal Poly Humboldt

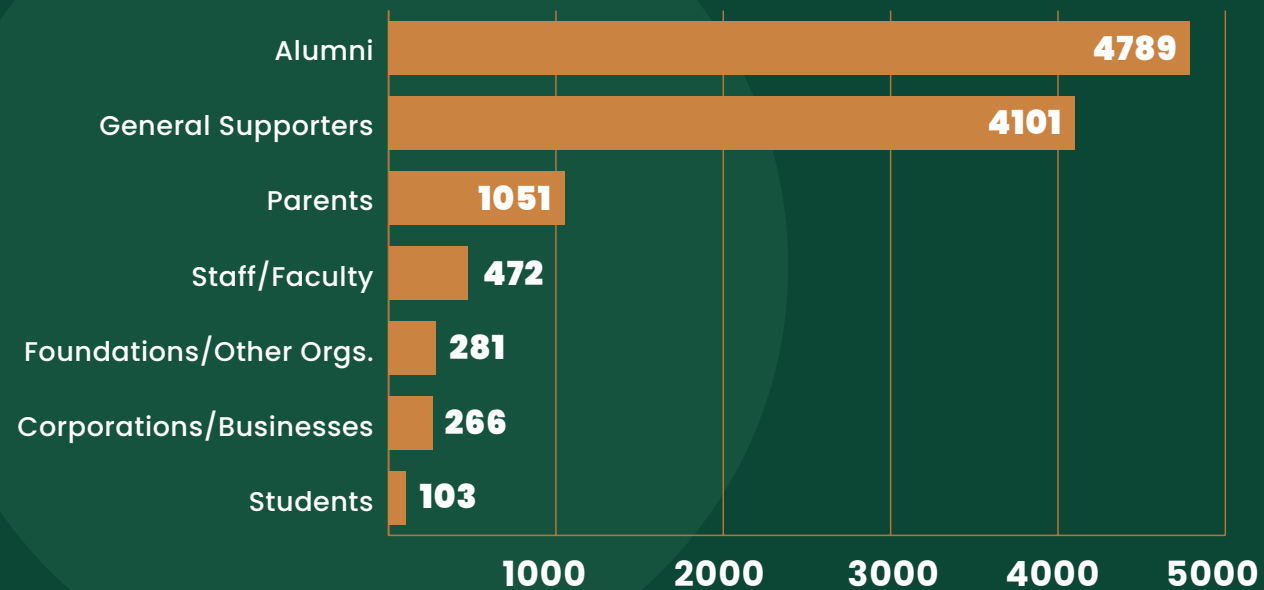
In 2020, before proudly becoming the first polytechnic university in Northern California and only the third in the California State University system, Cal Poly Humboldt set an ambitious goal: to raise \$50 million and chart a new course for the future. Thanks to donors, the University achieved its goal, expanded emergency housing, funded the campus food pantry, and created essential programs that help students navigate unexpected challenges.

Over **275** donors gave **\$10,000** or more, and the average gift during the Campaign was **four times higher** than the average during the years leading up to it.

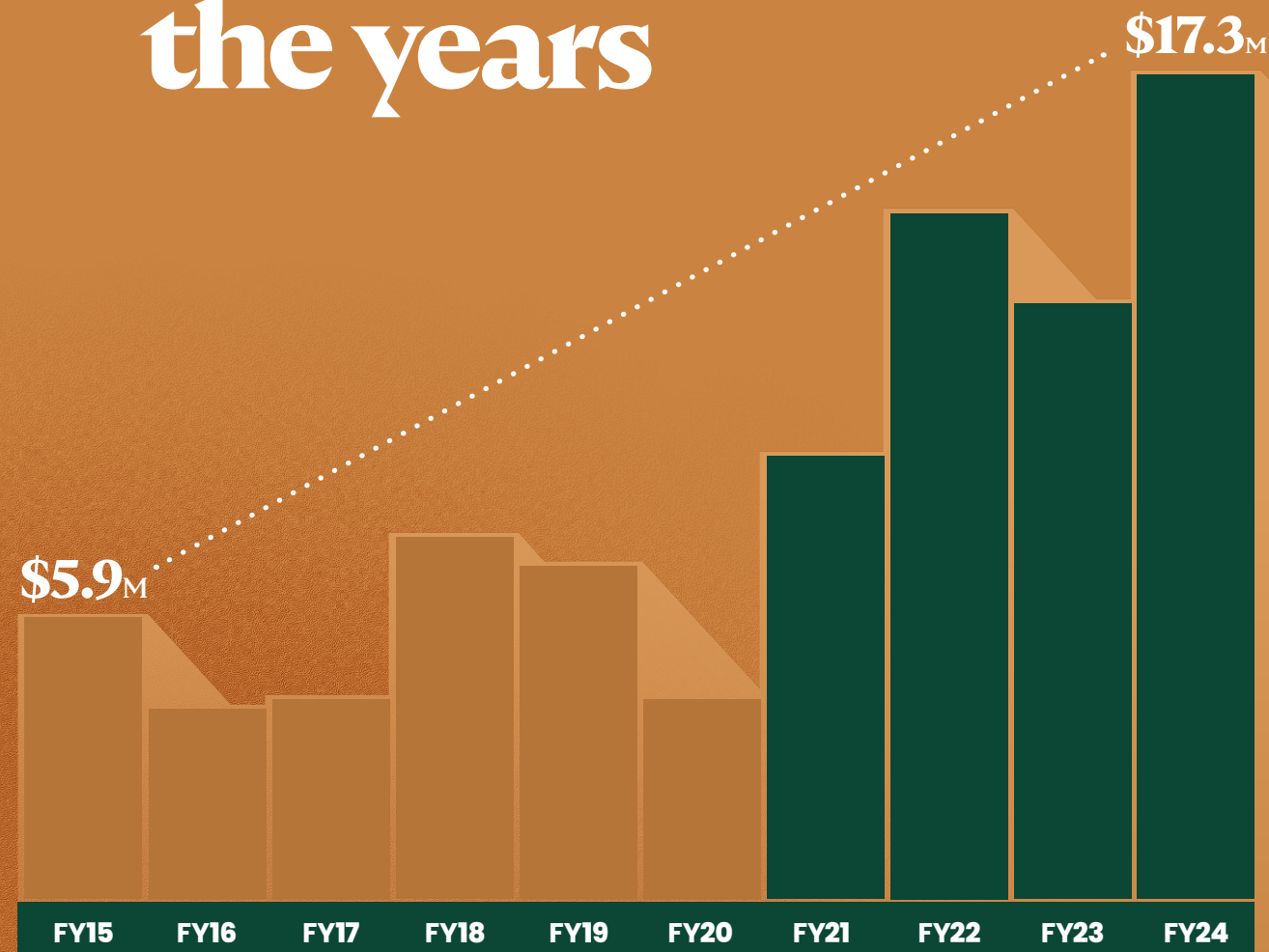
Donors range in age from **18-102**

DONOR COUNT BY TYPE

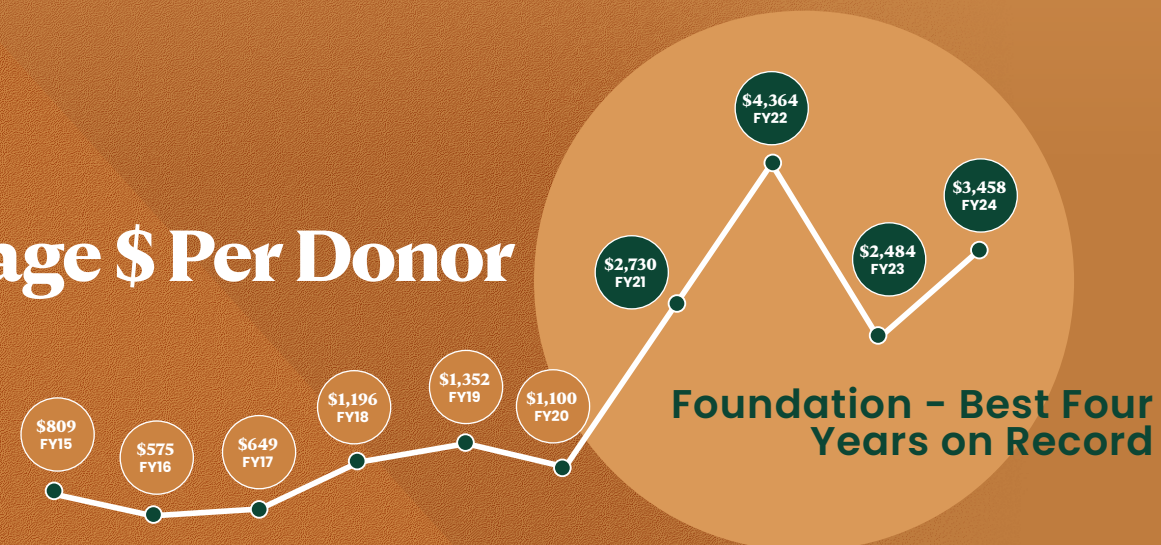


Giving through the years

1913 Legacy Society

The 1913 Legacy Society is made up of donors who have designated Humboldt in their estate plans and whose generosity will support a bolder future for generations. Over the course of the campaign 72 donors committed a total of \$21.4 million in planned gifts.

Looking Ahead

Donor support is truly transforming the Cal Poly Humboldt student experience. The generosity shown since the Boldly Rising Campaign started has already led to the four highest years of donor support in our University's history, showcasing the deep commitment of alumni, parents, friends, and community members. As Humboldt continues this bold journey, ongoing donor support will be essential to advancing the University's ambitious vision and empowering students to thrive for generations to come.

How Generosity Shaped A Bolder Future

Generous gifts have forged new scholarships, enriched existing ones, and unlocked a world of research and internship opportunities, hands-on experiences, specialized equipment, athletics, and beyond. This journey toward a bolder future began four years ago, and today, the progress is evident across the campus community. Here are a few examples of giving across campus.

Investing In Futures and Helping Local Students Thrive

Cal Poly Humboldt believes that access to education is essential for meaningful change. Early in the campaign, generous donors raised \$250,000 for the Humboldt First Scholarship, which offers up to \$4,000 to local high school graduates from Humboldt, Del Norte, Mendocino, or Trinity counties who enroll at Humboldt. The goal is to empower North Coast students to pursue four-year degrees while staying close to home. Transfer students from College of the Redwoods are also eligible.

Furthering this commitment, Dan ('91, Business and Computer Information Systems) and Cindy Phillips donated \$1 million to support Southern Humboldt graduates at Cal Poly Humboldt. Inspired by their generosity, Sherman Shapiro ('86, Environmental Systems) established a similar endowment, in the amount of \$400,000, for graduates of McKinleyville and Eureka high schools, together fostering future leaders and expanding educational access.



Researching Power for the Future of the Pacific Coast

Cal Poly Humboldt has launched the Pacific Offshore Wind Consortium (POWC) to enhance its focus on environmental and social responsibility and to help develop the workforce. The initiative has raised over \$1.6 million from donors, along with \$12 million in state and grant funding.

This is a joint effort between Cal Poly Humboldt's Schatz Energy Research Center, the Pacific Marine Energy Center at Oregon State University, and the Center for Coastal Marine Sciences at Cal Poly San Luis

Obispo. Each institution contributes specialized knowledge in environmental monitoring, interdisciplinary research, and technical evaluations of offshore wind.

"We are coming together as a consortium because we know we need to take bold action to address climate change, and offshore wind has the potential to play an important role," says Arne Jacobson, director of the Schatz Center.

Uniting to Build A Resilient North Coast Nursing Workforce

Cal Poly Humboldt is focused on improving the health of the North Coast community through its Nursing program.

Donors, including Providence St. Joseph Hospital Eureka, Sutter Coast Hospital, and the Humboldt Area Foundation's Orvamae Emmerson Endowment Fund, with the help of state funding championed by California State Senator and President Pro Tempore Mike McGuire, helped the University launch the RN to BSN program in Fall 2020. The mostly online program helps prepare nurses for leadership roles while allowing them to continue to work in the community.

"We are truly grateful for donors stepping up and making a major investment in advancing educational opportunities in our nursing workforce," McGuire says.

Several Nursing Scholarships have been created. Jack McGurk ('66, Biology) donated over \$100,000 to the Diana M. McGurk Memorial Scholarship Endowment. Robin Smith ('78, Nursing) gave \$150,000 for an endowed nursing scholarship, while Jacob Furgatch ('82, Nursing) committed \$100,000 for the Eden Rubio Furgatch Memorial Scholarship. Eden ('83, Nursing) and Michelle Donahue also contributed \$25,000 to the Donahue Joseph Scholarship Endowment.

Driving the Growth of Humboldt Athletics

Donor support has significantly enhanced Cal Poly Humboldt sports teams like Women's Rowing and Men's Wrestling, benefiting student-athletes and their programs.

A \$250,000 gift from retired Women's Rowing Coach Robin Meiggs ('89, Physical Education) and her husband Scott Heller—alongside over \$25,000 from alumni and community members—established the Robin A. Meiggs Scholarship for Women's Rowing athletes. Heller noted the scholarship will positively impact student-athletes for years. This funding contributed to the team winning their third national championship in 2023.

The revival of Cal Poly Humboldt's NCAA Division II Men's Wrestling program was also made possible through contributions from dedicated alumni, including \$10,000 from Tom Jones ('74, Physical Education), \$50,000 from Virgil Moorehead ('83, Education) and Craig Vejvoda ('80, Business Administration), and over \$300,000 from Dan Phillips ('91, Business and Computer Information Systems).

The student-run Humboldt International Film Festival (HIFF) has leveraged Cal Poly Humboldt's commitment to experiential learning, allowing students to gain invaluable hands-on experience and actively engage in the intricacies of running a film festival.

David Phillips ('69, Theatre Arts) donated over \$50,000 to create the David Phillips and Don McKenzie Humboldt International Film Festival Endowment in memory of his friend and fellow filmmaker, Don McKenzie ('69, Theatre, Film & Dance).

"I'm thrilled the Humboldt International Film Festival is still strong today. I needed to support this program financially so more students can have the real, hands-on experience of having their films screened in a public setting with a live audience," Phillips says.

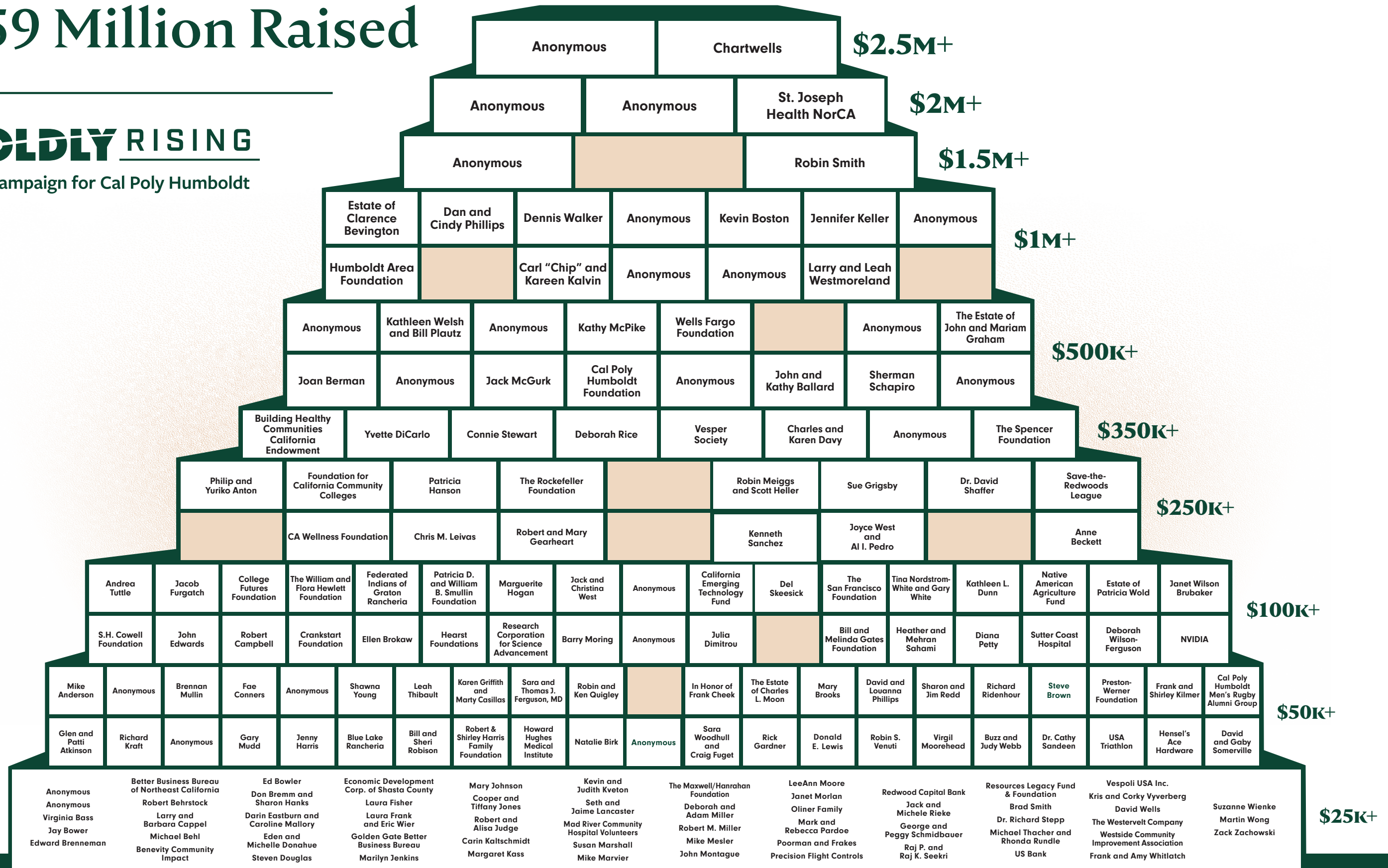
