



The campaign prioritizes scholarships and other financial support for students, hands-on learning and applied research, new and emerging technology throughout the curriculum, enhancement of academic programs, and creation of more equitable communities.

Expanding Access

Sherman Schapiro ('86, Environmental Systems) was inspired by a generous gift from **Dan Phillips** ('91, Business and Computer Information Systems) to create the Eureka High School Scholarship Fund. This fund provides financial assistance to Eureka High School graduates attending Cal Poly Humboldt.

Supporting Hands-On Learning

Mary and Robert Gearheart donated \$240,000 from their retirement account to the Cal Poly Humboldt Foundation to fund the Gearheart Ecological Engineering Research Fund. This initiative will provide fellowships and assistantships to support nature-based technological research and uphold environmental education standards for future Humboldt students.

Creating a Tech-Forward Campus

A \$500,000 gift from **Kathleen Welsh** in honor of her father, James Welsh, will allow Cal Poly Humboldt to acquire an electron microscope. This modern equipment will prepare students for biotech, chemistry, and biology research.

Enhancing the Academic Experience

Rick Gardner established the Rick M. Gardner Psychology Research Assistantship Fund with \$75,000. The fund provides funded research opportunities for Psychology students aspiring to a graduate degree with Cal Poly Humboldt faculty.

Acting for Equity

Jennifer Keller established the Mary and Foster Keller Scholarship Endowment 12 years ago to honor her parents. She recently pledged \$75,000 to the fund, which awards student recipients \$4,000 annually for four years based on exceptional academic merit and financial need.


